PRESIDENT:are you here? Senator Rumery.

CLERK: Senator Beutler voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman and Goodrich, are they here? They seem to be the ones that are a couple of them that are absent. Senator Haberman. Senator Goodrich is here. I see him now. Senator Haberman. Do you want to wait? Yes, I know you're....Senator Hefner, though has got the Call. Yes, we're accepting call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Goodrich voting no.

PRESIDENT: Not everybody is here Senator Hefner so...

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, we probably should have a roll call vote then.

CLERK: Senator Kelly had been voting aye, sir.

PRESIDENT: No, this is still on ceasing debate. Senator Haberman is now here. Do you want a roll call vote then on the question of ceasing debate?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Alright, call the roll then, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken which may be found on Pages 1799 and 1800 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Debate does not cease. We will continue the debate on the motion to indefinitely postpone. The Chair recognizes Senator Brennan. Does somebody want to raise the Call? The Call is raised. No objection. Senator Brennan.

SENATOR BRENNAN: I understand that the time has elapsed on the bill. Has it or has it not?

PRESIDENT: Well, I just told...reported to you that the Speaker extended the time to try to complete this particular phase. Speaker Marvel, what do you wish to do at this point?

SPEAKER MARVEL: As I indicated to you, there were about four more speakers. We've had some interruptions that are not the fault of the proponents of the bill. So I
