PRESIDENT: The question before the House then is the indefinite postponement of LB 489. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 11 nays to indefinitely postpone, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is indefinitely postponed. Proceed then with the next bill on Special Order for another 45 minutes, LB 11.

CLERK: Can I read a couple of things in?

PRESIDENT: Yes, and before we do that the Clerk has some matters to read in. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have Attorney General's opinions, one addressed to Senator Chambers regarding LB 319, a second to Senator DeCamp regarding a newspaper article. That will be inserted in the Legislative Journal. (See Pages 1800 through 1804 of the Journal.)

Senator Vickers asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 357, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We're ready?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: Ready then with LB 11. Mr. Clerk, do you want to read that?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 11 was introduced by Senator Reutzel of the 15th. (Read title to LB 11.) The bill was read on January 4 of this year. It was referred to the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by Senator Reutzel's Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee, Mr. President.
