PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel speaking to the committee amendments.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The amendments aside from being technical there are...that's what the amendments would provide that there are no more than fifty percent of the contributed money would go for manpower and support staff. This was agreed upon in committee. The Game and Parks Commission agreed to it, no problem, and I would move the adoption of those amendments.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker and members, I have a kill motion on this bill. I don't know whether it should be taken up now or after the amendments are adopted.

PRESIDENT: We're speaking to the committee amendments now. We're...we...

SENATOR KAHLE: Fine.

PRESIDENT: It would be proper to handle the committee amendments first.

SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, go ahead with the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: All right, any further discussion on the committee amendments? Senator Reutzel, I need a close. The motion before the House is the adoption of the committee amendments on LB 11. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? The question before the House is the adoption of the committee amendments on LB 11. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The committee amendments are adopted, and there is a Reutzel amendment ahead of the Kahle kill motion, so we'll take up the Reutzel amendment first.
