- CLERK: Yes, sir, Senator Stoney now moves to amend the bill, Mr. President. (Read Stoney amendment as found on Page 1806 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, as a member of the Constitutional Recreation and Revision Committee I was a little concerned with the ambitiousness with which we attacked this particular program and what I am attempting to do with this amendment if we are going to act favorable on this proposal, is to limit the amount of those dollars that can be expended for personal services, travel and equipment. Now I know that there has been some reduction with the amendment that was adopted in committee, but I feel that we should further pair that and reduce that fifty percent allocation that we now have in there to something more favorable and my favorable figure is twenty-five percent. So I would move for the adoption of that amendment.

-PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh. Call the question. Allright, Senator Marsh.....do I see five hands? I do. All those in favor of ceasing debate on the Stoney amendment vote aye, opposed nay. The question is, shall debate cease? Have you all voted? We're voting on ceasing debate. Have you all.....record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. Debate ceases. Senator Stoney, do you wish to close? That constitutes the close. The question is the adoption of the Stoney amendment to LB 11. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Are there any other amendments?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit moves to amend the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit. Now I must tell you we only have a few minutes...just a couple of minutes left on the bill, Senator Schmit.
