to LB 390. Have you all voted? The motion is the adoption of the Duis amendment to LB 390. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator 'Duis' amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I now move to advance the bill. I think we've gone over it very thoroughly in the last day and this morning, and so I would ask for the advancement of 390 to E & R.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance LB 390 to E & R for Engrossment. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Senator Kahle, 138.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I move that we...

CLERK: Mr. President, excuse me, Senator, we have E & R amendments to LB 138.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Thank you. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, I move the E & R amendments to LB 138.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I have an amendment on the medicaid bill that we're considering now which would reduce the scope of the bill from four years down to two years, and what it does in effect is this, is it reduces the county obligation from twenty percent down to fifteen percent over a two year period, and instead of from twenty percent down to ten percent over a four year period.
