SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of the Warner amendment to LB 138A vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now the motion is advancement of 138A to E & R for Engrossment. All in favor of that motion say aye. A machine vote has been requested. All in favor of the advancement of the A bill, 138A, to E & R for Engrossment vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? We're voting on the advancement of the A bill to E & R for Engrossment. SENATOR MURPHY: Very quickly, ladies and gentlemen, upon the advice of Senator Reutzel confirmed by the Attorney General, we should add to this the language that would establish the effective date. That is the sum and substance of it. It adds the effective date of such a proposition recommended by the bill's introducer, confirmed by the Attorney General, and I move the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Murphy amendment to LB 99 CA. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.
