SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are ready to take up LB 594. The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 594.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments to LB 594.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely, do you want to adopt the E & R amendments to 594?

SENATOR WESELY: I already moved them but I will move them again. I move the E & R amendments to LB 594.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. Would you like to go once more, Senator Wesely? (laughter.)

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have amendments offered by the Appropriations Committee and they are on page 1695 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move adoption of the committee amendments. These amendments have no additional general fund money. The first amendment, and they are found on page 1695, changes the limit from fifty to one hundred thousand where life cycle cost estimates, the cost of a facility in which life cycle cost estimates would be required and life cycle cost estimates is where the bids are required to take into account alternatives in which in some instances the initial cost for some item may be a little higher but because of its life the particular item, perhaps windows would be an example, that the higher cost item would be justified because in the long run it is more economical. The second amendment deals with the Game Commission with their cash funds for various park development, different locations and it came in at their request to exclude a couple of items on the list, Victoria Springs and Wagon Train, and they were asking to replace some residences which are used by Game Commission employees
