SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the Koch amendment to 594. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Koch amendment to LB 594. Have you all voted? Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, how many are excused and absent?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Four. There are three now I am told.

SENATOR KOCH: In that case I would ask for a Call of the House and a record vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Clear the board. The question is shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators return to their seats, record your presence. All unauthorized personnel leave the floor. Senator Burrows, Senator George, Senator Schmit, Senator Rumery, Senator Kahle, Senator Johnson, Senator Goodrich, Senator Newell, Senator Vickers, Senator Frank Lewis, Senator Chambers, Senator Reutzel. Senator George, Senator Schmit, the Chair would appreciate it if the legislators would return to their seats and record your presence. I would remind you that before us are six appropriation bills.
