SPEAKER MARVEL: Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 1813-1814 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. What is the next motion?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion is offered by Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman moves to amend the bill as follows: (Read Haberman amendment as found on page 1814 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. Chairman and fellow legislators, I couldn't believe my ears two or three days ago when a Lincoln senator got up on this floor and he referred to a pork barreling and a veterinarian college. I couldn't believe that a Lincoln senator would say pork barrel and the veterinarian college in the same sentence. So I want to talk about pork. Let's really talk about pork. Now here is some pork, Program 906, remodel the Eppley Building; Program 924, construct a new theater building; Program 902, buy the Elks Club Building for \$950,000, spend another million dollars to remodel it. This is pure sausage in its purest form if you want to talk about pork barreling. These projects can wait another year so I would ask that you support my amendment and take these three items out of the budget. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING
