CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment offered by Senator Fitzgerald and that amendment reads as follows: (Read Fitzgerald amendment found on page 1823 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Mr. Speaker, there are so many organizations in Omaha that have been buying pickles and they say well we are going to sell these for a nonprofit organization. They might sell one box and they have used three, four or five boxes and just take the money that they derive and just keep it. So this is the intent of the amendment. So any time there is a pickle sold and a person puts their money out they know what organization they are buying this pickle for.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to adopt the Fitzgerald amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Before some of the legislators leave I would like to make this announcement. We need some Final Reading tomorrow so I would like to have at least a quorum here at 8:30 and then the rest of you by nine. The first bill will be read around 8:30 so that by nine o'clock you can vote on it. It will take an hour of Final Reading. Then we will proceed to suspend the rules and take up about six motions that have not advanced and either vote them up or down after you agree to suspend the rules. Then we will proceed with the other business. I called this to your attention now because we need a quorum here at 8:30 so we can keep up with Final Reading. Now the Clerk will read the next amendment.
