LB 581, 234

No one has voted against the bill yet. Speaker Marvel, it is about one minute till, should we go ahead? Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1834, Legislative Journal.) The vote is 34 ayes, 0 nays, 13 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 581 passes on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 234.

CLERK: Read LB 234 on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 234 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted?

SENATOR REUTZEL: I would like to have a roll call since we are under Call.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel, you are requesting a roll call vote? All right. Let's have the roll call vote.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 1835, Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Sergeant at Arms, see where these people are. I know they have checked in. Senator Goodrich and Senator Johnson. Hold up on it until we find out where these people are. They are supposed to be at their seats. I have given some laxity this morning in being at your seats but now that we are having a roll call vote, I think it is time that we make sure everyone who is checked in is here. Okay, they can answer to the roll call, too.

SENATOR SIMON: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Simon, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SIMON: Would it be in order since we have been running back and forth to have us just check in to see how many people are missing that have (interruption.)

PRESIDENT: We know who is here. I think we can pretty much tell who is here. We know who is not here, too. Sergeant at Arms, see where Senator Goodrich is. Anyone whose name is called now and is not and is supposed to be here, we are
