SENATOR REUTZEL: I realize we are in the middle of a vote, but since the confusion erupted, would it be out of order to start the roll call over?

PRESIDENT: I think the Clerk will proceed with the roll call and pick up the names because we stopped at the names that weren't here. So those names will be called upon.

SENATOR REUTZEL: I only suggest that because it is difficult to keep track of the votes when we stop in the middle of the first row of names and we have to go back and pick some up.

PRESIDENT: All right, proceed with the roll call.
