SENATOR CULLAN: And I would like to say, initially, that I have a great deal of respect for Senator Marvel and the way that he has operated the Legislature or the way he has ran the legislative process up to this point but I think it is wrong to suspend the rules and move a number of bills and some of these bills I support and some I might not necessarily support but that is not the issue. I don't think any bill simply because it is controversial in nature or simply because it may be more important to a few more individuals in this Legislature than other bills should be given this type of special treatment. I think the bills have failed to advance once, each of these bills, and they should come up in their regular order as per our existing rules. I think it is very wrong, and I feel very strongly, that no bill, and if I had one of my own I would feel the same way, no bill should be given this type of special treatment and so I will vote very strongly against the motion to suspend the rules and I will vote against the advancement of each of these bills until they are placed in their proper order for consideration by this body.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President, I have a question for Senator Marvel.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, will you respond?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.
