SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, a question of the Chair. Is the House under Call?

PRESIDENT: The House is still under Call, yes, sir.

SENATOR KEYES: Then I would ask that everybody respectfully take their seat until we remove the Call.

PRESIDENT: All right. Thanks, Senator Keyes. Senator Keyes has reminded the Chair that the House is under Call. Will all nonlegislative personnel leave the floor, all members resume their places at their desks. This House will come under order, come to order and pay attention to Senator Keyes. Whenever you feel that they are paying attention to you, why you may proceed. That might be a long while.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Mr. Speaker, I am a very young man. I presume that Senator Murphy and Senator Newell and my good friend, Senator Chambers, and Senator Wesely will be in their seats in a very short time.
