SPEAKER MARVEL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 6 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats, record your presence. Unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. While we are waiting for legislators to return to their seats and record their presence, the note that I have here indicates that there are in the balcony 42 sixth grade students from Morton School in Hastings, Nebraska. Miss Anderson is the teacher. Are you up in this balcony? Will you raise your hand so we can say good morning? Senator Warner, would you record your presence? Senator Keyes, would you record your presence? Senator Newell, Senator Brennan, Senator Simon, Senator Labedz, Senator Haberman. Record your presence, please. There are two absent, Senator Goodrich and Senator Labedz. Senator Carsten, do you want to close on your comments and then we have to move to bring the bill back.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, I am not going to prolong the closing. We have spent a lot of time this morning on other things. I think that you are well aware of the situation as has been explained and discussed. I ask for your assistance in bringing this bill back for this specific amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Carsten, were you closing? Senator Keyes, your light is on. Senator Carsten closed. The motion is the return of LB 285 to Select File for specific amendment. All those in favor of the return of the bill vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 7 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.
