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receipts than anticipated but less receipts, and as long as we are forecasting economically, I think we had better take a serious look as to the delay of the farmers getting into the fields and what that, in fact, is doing to economic forecast in the State of Nebraska, and I think if there is any doubt in any one's mind as to what that effect is, they ought to look at the grain future's market. It is going up. They are saying there could very well be a shortage of grain because of the late planting season. I think we also ought to think of the shortage of fuel to take care of the agricultural industry. So if we are going to rationalize ourselves into this \$10 million expenditure based on rosy economic forecast and if we are going to start throwing a dart against the board as to what the economy is going to be, I think we had better take a real serious look as to the real possibility of a recession.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have forty-five seconds.

SENATOR DWORAK: So I think Senator Keyes, even though he may have a good idea and if he wants to prioritize it, that is fine but then if we are going to put this \$10 million as part of our expenditure, we have got to figure out where we are going to cut \$10 million and stay within that 7% limitation. We can't have everything obviously. The Budget Committee can't have everything, this body can't have everything, the state can't have everything. We have to live within those financial fiscal restraints. So I would go along with Senator Keyes amendment when and if he shows me where he is going to cut the expenditures so that we stay within our budget projections.

SPEAKER MARVEL: First of all, the Banking Committee would like a meeting underneath the South balcony immediately which will last approximately three minutes. All members of the Banking Committee underneath the South balcony. The Chair recognizes Senator Fitzgerald.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Mr. Speaker and members, I want to talk on the bill not on the Senator's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to talk on the amendment?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: The bill proper. I want to talk on the bill proper, not the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I will call on you at the proper time then. Thank you. Senator Cope, do you wish to speak on the amendment?
