SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, we are going to have to have them come in anyway. So maybe what we ought to do...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, let's record the vote on this anyway.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate has ceased and Senator Brennan is recognized to close on his amendment to LB 585.

SENATOR BRENNAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I didn't intent to criticize any part of the school system. I think that this Legislature should have some kind of knowledge of where the expenditures are going and what they are being used for and I don't think the amendment says that the Appropriation Committee has a right to change it but I think they ought to be reported. Thank you. I urge the advance of this amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is on the adoption of the Brennan amendment to LB 585. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Brennan, what is your pleasure?

SENATOR BRENNAN: I hate to do it but I ask for a Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Clear the Board. The question before the House is shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried. The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats, record your presence. Unauthorized personnel leave the floor. As soon as you all get in your seats the Clerk can accept call in votes. Senator Murphy, Senator Landis, Senator Koch, Senator Warner, Senator George, Senator Cope, Senator Keyes, Senator Schmit, Senator Lamb, Senator Johnson. The Clerk is authorized to accept call in votes as long as all legislators are in their seats.
