SENATOR KELLY: Okay.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Murphy, your light is on.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. President, in the spirit of good humor, I would like to know if Senator Newell's statement that he is not a fool is a debatable issue?

SENATOR NICHOL: I am pondering that. Senator Newell, did you wish to say something?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, Mr. President, I hope that it is not Senator Kelly's intent to create a problem here. If it is, you know, I would hope that Senator Kelly would reconsider his objection to lay it over, primarily so that I don't have to ask a whole lot of people to speak on it for the next thirty minutes in order to get us to adjournment time and so forth. I think that it would be most courteous if Senator Kelly would withdraw his objection and we could lay this over and get to some of the other business. Otherwise, I have a lot to talk about the bill and its merits.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Kelly, I have checked this...Senator Kelly, I have checked this and, yes, it is 25 votes. Excuse me, Senator Kelly and Senator Newell....Senator Newell, I just made a mistake. It is the majority of those voting to lay the bill over so shall we go ahead and take the vote on to lay it over? We are voting to lay the bill over and it takes a simple majority. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 1 nay to lay the bill over, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: The bill is laid over. May I please introduce on behalf of Senator Simon 42 fourth grade students from Cottonwood Elementary School in Millard, Nebraska. Gail Blanchard is their teacher and they are in the North balcony. Will you please welcome them? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: We are going to go through some of these bills that are without any amendments so I will move them rather quickly. I move the E & R amendments to LB 391.

SENATOR NICHOL: All those in favor of adopting the E & R amendment please say aye, opposed nay. It is advanced.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move that LB 391 be advanced
