SENATOR DeCAMP: No, I think I was waiting on 378 but that was about twenty minutes ago.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. The motion is to advance LB 141 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. All in favor say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. Bill is advanced. Senator Murphy, is LB 86 ready to be considered?

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, I recognize you. I am sorry, the Clerk has to read something first.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 86 that need to be adopted.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments to LB 86.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted. Senator Murphy. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, I have three amendments from Senator Murphy. The first is on page 1728 of the Journal.

SENATOR MURPHY: This is the public records issue and the people from NPPD and that who have such installations as nuclear power and that have asked that we make explicit the fact that the security records, combinations, formulas, locks, this sort of thing, not be subject to free examination as a public record. I have found no one in objection to this. I would move the adoption of the amendment as stated.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I would move the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: What page is the amendment on?

CLERK: Page 1728.

SENATOR MURPHY: It refers specifically to locks and combinations that are used as security measures by and specifically it came from those controlling nuclear power installations. I would move its adoption.
