CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the first Murphy amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Murphy amendment is adopted. Now, Senator Murphy, you have two more amendments. If there is any controversy on them, we are going to have to close down shop?

SENATOR MURPHY: That is fine, Senator.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to explain the next amendment?

SENATOR MURPHY: I think Senator Chambers has a comment, Mr. Speaker. Now I would move, to put an issue before the body, for the adoption of this amendment relating to locks and....

SPEAKER MARVEL: What page is it found on?

CLERK: 1728.

SPEAKER MARVEL: 1728. Senator Chambers, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I am going to ask Senator Murphy to help me. If we....the amendment you are talking about adopting now is on page 1728 of the Journal, is that correct?

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now the first line says, insert on page 2, line 25. Where would that be found in the Journal of what we just adopted starting on page 1827?

SENATOR MURPHY: I believe your pages are a sequence of line numbers, aren't they, Senator. They don't number the pages in the Journal in these reprints but I think the line numbers indicate the page changes. I don't believe they insert the page number per se.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if I look at what appears to be page 2 based on the line numbers, in line 25, it seems like the wording would be petitioning the Attorney General to review the record and I don't see the "secrets" behind which this first part of the amendment is to apply, because you are talking about academic and scientific also. Can somebody help me find the line 25 where the word "secrets" appears? I know where line 25 is, Senator DeCamp, but there
