SENATOR NEWELL: I'm not sure that is true Senator. I'm not at all sure that it is true. Whatever we do we need to adopt this amendment so that if we do pass the bill it can, we do not have a misdemeanor for those people who park illegally.

SENATOR NEWELL: There are three changes. One, we strike the misdemeanor Class III misdemeanor which is a criminal penalty. Instead of having a criminal penalty in there, it then becomes a civil penalty which then has to be adjudicated in court or in the small claims court.

SENATOR KREMER: Yes sir Senator Newell, I understand that. Now go on.

SENATOR NEWELL: Okay, the next thing was we changed motor vehicles, cars to motor vehicles because of the obvious.
