I'm sure that we can cut that down, especially if it is manufactured here in the State of Nebraska where there would be no interstate commerce coming in and no shipments made into the State of Nebraska and the testing would be done here if it is manufactured here. I urgently request that LB 382A be moved because shortly after that we have LB 382 on Select File and the bill itself will be debated at that time. I believe what we are going to do first is vote on the A bill so that we can get it off of General File so that it will catch up with LB 382 which is now on Select. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I would have a question of Senator Labeledz if she would yield please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz, would you respond?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes sir.

SENATOR CULLAN: Senator Labeledz the current fiscal impact on 382A is \$10,000 is that correct? General Fund moneys?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, but....

SENATOR CULLAN: What is the fiscal impact that the new A bill after the amendments would suggest?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Anywheres from 50 to 70 thousand. But, as I say we will be talking to the Health Department. I don't believe some of the things that they are listing are necessary like a laboratory scientist number two at \$15,000 per year just to test laetrile for purity.

SENATOR CULLAN: Are there amendments pending currently to raise this fiscal impact so that it moves in conformance with the funds required by the Department of Health?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes.

SENATOR CULLAN: Are they pending now?

SENATOR LABEDZ: You mean the new fiscal notes?

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes.
