SENATOR DeCAMP: If it's an easy one.

PRESIDENT: Yes, if it's easy.

SENATOR CULLAN: Senator DeCamp, what is the current fiscal note for this bill? What is the current impact?

SENATOR DeCAMP: The one that we're advancing right now?

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I don't know. I'd have to look it up. I guess you could look that up as well as I could. I don't have it right before me. As I say, it will be a completely different one.

SENATOR CULLAN: It will be a completely different one? On what basis will it be a completely different one?

SENATOR DeCAMP: We're eliminating more than three-fourths of the computer use, which was \$50,000 a jump, or in excess of that. We're using a simple occupation tax, and some other refinements. We're using things like that.

SENATOR CULLAN: Well, again, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, as Senator DeCamp indicated this is an important vote relative to LB 180, and again I would hope that you would vote not to advance this particular piece of legislation. Again, we're in another situation where we are simply giving Senator DeCamp another vote off General File not knowing what we are going to have on Select File with Final Reading, and who knows, this is some kind of a tax bill and maybe they will repeal my 103 in this thing. I think maybe we ought to kill it while we've got a chance.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol. Senator Nichol calls for the question. Do I see five hands? I do. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and debate ceases. Senator DeCamp is ready to vote. That concludes his summation and all those in favor of advancing LB 120A vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.
