SENATOR VENDITTE: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: It goes down to the bottom...the bottom of this category here.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Okay. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: In other words you've got LB 120 which we have to pass over today, we have 382, 357, 444 and 11, go to the bottom of that category.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Are we sticking very strictly then, Mr. Speaker to the 30 minutes?

SPEAKER MARVEL: To the 30 minutes? Yes, sir.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Yes, sir, or does it...do we have ten or so minutes...

SPEAKER MARVEL: No.

SENATOR VENDITTE: But it's a 30 minute time limit?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes. Do you have some amendments you want to take up first, or what?

SENATOR VENDITTE: I don't, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are there amendments on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, we have E & R amendments that we have to deal with.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. In fairness to those who are interested in 382, we need to have your attention for the next 30 minutes. Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 382.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have amendments offered by Senator DeCamp. Those amendments are referenced on Page 1690 of the Journal, but you'll find them...they're printed separately and you'll find them in your bill books.
