SPEAKER MARVEL: You have one minute left.

SENATOR LANDIS: I did not object at that time. However, I do object to the name change now because of the substance in this instance and also because of the doctrine and the course of action that it leads us to. This is not the logical change Senator Wesely would suggest, semantically it seems so obvious. I would hope that the body would reject this not only because it was not heard at hearing, and there has been no public input, but also because it is simply substantively wrong to apply the name Commissioners in this instance. I hope you will oppose the Wesely amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the.... Senator Chambers, do you wish....

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I just returned from the Library Commission and it seems to me that they're talking in Senator Wesely's amendment about changing the names of people who sit on the Court of Industrial Relations to Commissioners. Is that correct?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Mr. Clerk, do you want to read the Wesely amendment?

CLERK: Senator, it's on Page 1879. I think it would be easier to say that for the most part it changes the word Judge to Commissioner.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, the other day I didn't have the opportunity to speak on the move by the Legislature to change the term Court to Commission, and now they're trying to complete it by changing the word Judge to Commissioner. I've said on the floor before, Senator Landis, and sometimes it's like water on a duck's back that there are certain things that the Legislature cannot do simply by changing the definition of a word. If a court is going to review the operations of an agency, the nature of the agency will be determined by its operation not by a name which is artificially attached to it. So if an agency is performing all the duties of a court, and utilizing the procedures of a court, that agency will be held to the standard of a court in the way it operates. You have the same opportunity to review the proceedings of that court. You will be
