SPEAKER MARVEL: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The House is under Call. All legislators please return to your domain. Record your presence.

SENATOR NEWELL: How many people are excused and how many people can be rounded up?

CLERK: There are twelve excused, Senator.

SENATOR NEWELL: So there are two that are not excused that are still to be found? Can we call in votes?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Clerk is authorized to accept call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator George voting aye. Senator Clark voting no. Senator Cullan still voting no. Senator Marsh voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: How many have you got? Okay, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote may be found on Pages 1929 and 1930 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Do you have another amendment?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Senator Brennan moves to amend the bill. (Read Brennan amendment to LB 467 as found on Page 1930 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BRENNAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, originally this bill was introduced to allow inspections by the Labor Department of power districts and water districts. The only opposition was from a small power company who said it should be directed to all subdivisions of the state government which is taken care of in paragraph one of the amendments. Number two, the Labor Department said the federals would not take jurisdiction as far as the subdivisions of the state and the political subdivisions, but they could make inspections upon request and as I understood it this bill would allow
