Select File for the specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill has been returned. Senator Warner has explained it to you. The motion is the adoption of the amendment as explained by Senator Warner. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the Warner amendment. Record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely, do you want to move the bill, LB 589?

SENATOR WESELY: I move that LB 589 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. Next bill is LB 594. No, 594. There are three more bills. If I can have your cooperation, we will have this at least done. Are there any amendments to LB 594?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lewis moves to return LB 594 to Select File for specific amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes...is Senator Lewis in the room?
