had has been on the issue that I had hoped would be discussed and I appreciate that. One other factor in looking ahead that I failed to mention is the fact that revenue sharing is in all probability going to be repealed as far as what the state gets and our projections where we will be picking up next year about \$7.3 million there, there is some possibility, I don't think probability, but some possibility that we could end up with only \$7.3 million this year instead of the \$15.6 million that we have anticipated but again I want to repeat the thing that the only issue before you is the probability of the state being able to stay within the 7% on next year's, too, and the commitments that are contained in the bill add to it. There is a difficulty of being able to do that. Perhaps with inflation it would be impossible in any event but the purpose of the amendment was to draw out that kind of conversation and discussion as we consider not only this bill but other pending bills that carry appropriations that will have either an increase included for us for next year or at least a continuation base that has to be taken into account.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of the adoption of the amendment vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move that LB 594 be readvanced to E & R for engrossment and I ask for a machine vote please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of readvancing the bill to E & R for engrossment vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to readvance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The bill is readvanced. Are you ready for the next amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner...

SENATOR WARNER: Pat, withdraw that amendment.
