PRESIDENT: All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Shall the House go under Call? Have you all voted for the House to go under Call? Record the vote.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 11 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring all the members of the Legislature into the Chamber. All members will return to their desks and register their presence at this time, and then we will proceed with the DeCamp motion on LB 594. The House is under Call. All nonlegislative personnel will leave the floor of the Legislature. All legislators will return to their desks, and please register your presence. Would you all register your presence so we can continue with the business of the afternoon? Senator Merz, will you register your presence? Senator Landis is here. Will you register your presence? Senator Haberman, will you register your presence? Senator Brennan, will you register your presence? Senator Pirsch. Senator Clark, Senator Lewis, and Senator Haberman is sitting up here and is not registered in yet. You're showing that he is not there, is that it? That's true. Just leave it that way. That's the way it should be. Senator Lewis is on his way. Senator DeCamp, do you want to wait, Senator Lewis is on his way. Senator Clark is here. Senator Lewis is on his way, and Senator Koch is excused. Senator Clark says to....Senator DeCamp, do you want to....Senator Lewis is the only one who is not excused and he is on his way.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, it's kind of his puppy so he ought to get here.

PRESIDENT: If you want to wait for him, he is on his way they said, so....I don't know where he's headed from.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, let's start with a board vote and see what happens there.

PRESIDENT: You have finished your closing and do you want to close at this point?
