CLERK: (Roll call vote was taken which may be found on Page 1946 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The motion is adopted. The amendment is adopted. Now we have a motion on the desk. Alright, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move to readvance LB 594.

PRESIDENT: Alright, motion to readvance LB 594. Alright, machine vote has been requested on the readvance to Select File. All those in favor of readvancing LB 594 to E & R vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 17 nays on the motion to readvance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and LB 594 is advanced to E & R for Engrossment. Now, motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis moves to return LB 594 to Select File for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I described for you earlier in the day the description of my amendment to LB 594. Basically it strikes the figure of \$6,100,000 and replaces it with the figure of \$3,400,000. The Clerk has the exact figures and would be happy to read them for you, I'm sure. The project is designed in two parts, the renovation of the Temple Building, the addition of some experimental space, a new feeder and the like. The suggestion that I have made is to construct the addition now. The reason to choose that of the two portions of the project is that while the addition is being constructed they can continue to use the existing facility. Once the addition is completed they'll come back and ask for the renovation section of the building in years future when we don't have the obligations problems we have now. When that occurs they will be able to continue on their program in the addition that we will have constructed with this money.
