PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment to LB 585. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator DeCamp, what do you wish to do?

PRESIDENT: Don't do that.

SENATOR DeCAMP:Call, I guess...

PRESIDENT: Call of the House.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Call of the House is in. Clear the board. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring all the members back to the chamber and all members will return to their desks and register their presence. All nonlegislative personnel will leave the floor. All legislators return to their desks. While we're waiting for this, the Chair would like to introduce from Senator Carsten's district thirteen 3rd, 4th and 5th graders, one teacher and four mothers from the Otoe Public School District Number 78, from Otoe, Nebraska. They're here in the north balcony. Would they kind of wave to us up there? And don't lean too far over, you'll fall down. Everyone....would all of the members who are in this chamber register their presence so we can complete this vote? Would all members return to their desks and register their presence? It is three o'clock and we haven't even got to Agenda Item 6 yet. It's going to be a long day, a long night. Okay. Senator Brennan, will you...Senator Goodrich will you register your presence? Senator Kelly. Senator Newell. Alright, ready. Now you want a roll call vote at this point?
