SENATOR DeCAMP: No, just...heck, it's got 255,000,000 of other people's money. I don't care.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wagner, for what purpose do you rise? Yes, Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker, there were four of us senators asked to be excused and I left that with the Clerk up there. Senator Kennedy and...was...Senator Kennedy and Senator Hefner were excused.

PRESIDENT: Now, was that just to visit the Governor's office?

SENATOR WAGNER: Yes, for a 3:00 appointment.

PRESIDENT: Well, they're in the building though. They can be recalled for a Call of the House any time.

SENATOR WAGNER: Well, for the matter of the record they were asked to be excused.

PRESIDENT: I had no knowledge. They weren't officially excused, so...alright, record the vote then.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 21 nays to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is advanced to E & R for Engrossment. Okay, Mr. Clerk, does that take care of all those bills on....what's that? Oh, there is a motion? Is this on this same bill?

CLERK: Yes, sir, it is.

PRESIDENT: Alright, there's a motion by Senator Dworak. Motion on the desk. Read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dworak moves to return LB 585 to Select File for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, I guess we understand now totally the mood of the body. We've put...we've broken our seven percent, and so be it. This is a collective body. We abide and live by these collective decisions. I agree with everything everyone said on the DeCamp amendment. It's put money into schools. It will relieve property tax to a certain extent. I also
