PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Lewis. Where is Senator Frank Lewis? The House....yes, Senator Lewis. You are next.

SENATOR LEWIS: Well, Mr. President, I don't want to delay anything but if Senator Dworak now has changed his mind and wants to put \$35,000,000 in that's fine with me. I said on the floor day before yesterday I'll sure vote for it. Let's go.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Simon.

SENATOR SIMON: Mr. President and members of the body, I guess I would have to question somewhat the sincerity of a couple previous speakers. I happened to check to see Senator Cullan's voting record on \$10,000,000 and he was against it, but I certainly appreciate the born again Christian attitude which Senator Cullan has taken. He has seen the light and decided that \$10,000,000 is not enough but 35 is. I might also remind the body that Senator Dworak has not always been the strongest staunch supporter for state aid that I can recall in this body. So I guess I think I can certainly very clearly see the game plan....\$10,000,000 may fly, 35 will not, let's jack it up and get the thing vetoed, let's get the thing killed. I don't want to play those games. I would support \$35,000,000 personally, but I think I can see the \$10,000,000 is as much as we can get. Let's stop playing games. Let's move on to more important issues.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, Senator Cullan and I were just talking. Both of us voted against the \$10,000,000 increase for the same kinds of reasons that it did not give enough property tax relief. I appreciate the fact that Senator Dworak has brought this amendment to us and I expect to support it, and Senator Cullan told me he also expects to support it.
