SENATOR DeCAMP: Right.

SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you, Senator DeCamp. I oppose this amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I have a question. I guess Senator DeCamp could probably answer it. I'm concerned about the fiscal impact. We have no indication of the fiscal impact of this amendment, do we?

SENATOR DeCAMP: There's no fiscal impact until '81.

SENATOR MURPHY: We currently are paying the Governor \$40,000 a year?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Is that what we are? I don't know.

SENATOR MURPHY: And without any retirement provision. Well, then the judges' retirement provision provides that they will retire at what? Let me ask....

SENATOR DeCAMP: I don't know. I'd have to look up their...

SENATOR MURPHY: Alright, back to the fiscal impact...

SENATOR DeCAMP: Willie Hasebroock would know that better than I would.

SENATOR MURPHY: Back to the fiscal impact...

SENATOR DeCAMP: 70 I guess, somebody told me.

SENATOR MURPHY: Back to the fiscal impact. We appropriated over \$600,000 this year to the judges pension fund in addition to what he is being paid for a very handsome retirement, and in addition to that a couple of years ago we said, he could also take along with him his OAB which previously had been deductible from the total pension. I think when we talk about a judge's salary we ought to talk about the whole salary. The other \$602,000 that we appropriated this year to match it and the impact of this is going to make that about \$800,000 next year. Let's talk about the whole package not just what's on the surface.
