SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. There are no other lights, Senator Dworak, so Senator George will close.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you, I would like to say in closing, I would partially agree with Senator Stoney but unfortunately if we do not put this amendment on LB 344 nobody will have that option to put it in the rules and regulations. The law has to say that option clearly is available. Rules and regulations confer the specified, maybe what kind of equipment has to be put in or how many cubic feet per minute have to be turned over and in a specific public place that can be left to rules and regulations but if we don't say here in LB 344 very clearly that that is the option, then the department with rules and regulations could not possibly come up with suggesting that so the law has to have that kind of an amendment first. I urge you to vote for the amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to return LB 344 to Select File for Senator George's specific amendment. All those in favor of returning the bill vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator George, what is your pleasure?

SENATOR GEORGE: I believe, Mr. President, everybody is here but there seems to be a lot of conferences going on on the floor so I will ask for a roll call and that might get everybody back to his or her seat.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to clear the board, Mr. Clerk? A roll call has been requested. A roll call has been requested on Senator George's motion on LB 344. Will the legislators please take their seats and the Clerk will call the roll.
