SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? Okay. The question is, shall the House go under Call? All in favor of going under Call, placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators return to your seats, record your presence.

SENATOR DeCAMP: A question of the Chair. Does this change the Speaker's order?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No. Senator Kennedy, Senator Murphy, Senator Koch, Senator Keyes, Senator Schmit, Senator Lamb, Senator Kahle, Senator Hasebroock, Senator Merz, Senator Haberman, Senator Newell, Senator Vickers, Senator Simon, Senator Chambers, Senator Pirsch. Senator Koch, would you record your presence, please? The only person missing, Senator Hoagland...there is Senator Kennedy. Do you want to call the roll?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I think a couple of call in votes might solve the problem, Mr. Speaker. I think we are about at 23 right now.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All legislators in their seats.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: If a couple people would call affirmative votes in to lay this over a day we wouldn't have to have a roll call.

CLERK: Senator Wagner.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I would ask for a roll call vote then.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Pardon?
