SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman, Senator Cullan, Senator Wagner, Senator Hoagland, Senator Pirsch. Senator Labeledz, will you record your presence, please? Senator Stoney. Senator Hoagland, will you record your presence? Senator DeCamp. Senator Haberman, will you record your presence, please? Senator Cullan, will you record your presence? Since all legislators are in their seats the Clerk can accept call in votes. We are voting on the advancement of LB 356 to E & R for engrossment.

CLERK: Senator Landis voting aye; Senator Beutler voting aye; Senator Clark votes aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? Do you want a roll call vote? Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 1966-1967 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 10 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carries. The bill is advanced. We go to next and last motion is LB 121.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit moves to place LB 121 on General File pursuant to Rule 3, Section 10.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I will not take a great deal of your time. I do think it is important that this Legislature go on record as being in support of the recommendation of Governor Thone when he stipulated in his early address that he would place \$1,000,000 in his budget to be used for the promotion of gasohol. I think the record of history is clear that this state and this nation is at the mercy of the major oil companies and failure on the part of the federal government to investigate the serious problems that have beset this country has resulted in the crisis that we face today. I think that if the Attorney General of the United States had instigated anti-trust action years ago we would not be in this situation. The provisions of LB 121 provide for the funding for LB 434 that was passed by the Legislature last year. The Appropriation Committee has some question as to the, I believe, authenticity of some of the requests for funding that came as a result of the passage of that bill last year, but I do
