is the one area of agreement that we have and with respect to this we join hands and hope that you will support the amendment to LB 363.

SENATOR CLARK: Before we have the next speaker I would like to introduce from Senator Kremer's district, fourteen third and fourth graders from Hampton, Nebraska, one teacher, Mrs. Jennifer Long, and three mothers. Would you raise your hands up there so we can see where you are? Welcome to the Legislature. Also we have from Senator Sieck's district, ten fifth and sixth graders from Staplehurst, Nebraska, one teacher, Trudy Lagner and one adult with them. Will you raise your hands? I think most of them have gone. Welcome to the Legislature. Thank you. Senator Kahle is next, please.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President, members of the body, I would like to ask a question, I believe of Senator Warner, if I could and also probably Senator Koch as we go along, but, Senator Warner, didn't we pass a bill last year whereby the Board of Equalization or, I believe that is who it was, that would be able to adjust between counties the amount of money that would be collected for purposes such as technical community colleges? Was that bill passed last year?

SENATOR WARNER: There was a constitutional amendment adopted. That is the only thing I can think of which if it is in effect until January 1 of 1981 and where one county is reappraised and put into effect and the adjoining county has not reappraised, that then the two...the Board of Equalization has the power to keep the same proportionate amount of taxes paid in that coming year until the other county had also reappraised when they were both involved in the overlapping...

SENATOR KAHLE: Do you see this as being any...having any useful application to this situation that we have out in western Nebraska?

SENATOR WARNER: Are some of them reappraised and some...

SENATOR KAHLE: Some are reappraised as I understand it and some of them aren't. Perhaps some of the people from out there could help us on this but...

SENATOR WARNER: I would assume that, I know the constitutional amendment was self-implementing and I would assume that if one county is reappraised, the other had not, that
