CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR NEWELL: Could I amend the...?

SPEAKER MARVEL: This is beginning to remind me of last Thursday but go ahead.

SENATOR NEWELL: I know it is and...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell, you have a motion before the House.

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I would like to amend that motion and make it May 11th instead.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell, if you have another amendment, do you wish to withdraw this? You have to put it in writing. If you want to change it, come on down and give it to the Clerk.
