SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, my motion is to return the bill and put that on. Now I have agreed, I have agreed to pull the motion and do it in a separate bill. I have done this because Senator Carsten has made it abundantly clear to me, that this is the only way he would accept this happening. He feels, and I have to believe he knows what he is doing. He feels that this bill has to pass today so that three thousand eight hundred something or another can be sent somewhere to subdivisions of government. I don't understand all the ramifications. I have to take his word for it. I have taken his word for it and the other procedure will work. It may be a little shakier but it is more solid in terms of getting this handled on this end at this time and getting the other problem solved. So I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment with the understanding you all know the problem now and you know what we have to do to correct it and I repeat, it is an absolutely mandatory thing. Senator Beutler touched upon it. It really has to be done and he wants to do this other way so that is fine by me. Ask unanimous consent to withdraw it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: No objections? So ordered. He doesn't have to have a permission. He can withdraw his own amendment, yes. The amendment is withdrawn. Do we have anything else before the House?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Keyes moves to return LB 285 to Select File for a specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the enacting clause.
