to go up 14% at the minimum. Some may go up 3 or 4 but some may go up as much as 20 or 25% just to keep the spending at 107%. We sold the people of this state... Charlie Thone sold the people of this state on a 5% in the constitution. We have sold the people of this state on a 7% lid on property taxes and we are repudiating it. We are going to let the people of this state go as much as 7, 14, 20, 25% increase in the property taxes. Let me tell you one thing, my friends, when the people walk down here, walk up next September, get their tax statement and go to your county courthouse and your county assessor says, that is too bad. That is the way it is. You can raise property taxes all you want to. There is no limit on property taxes. You know that and I know it. They can go up as much as 7% of the total budget allows them to go. So if you have a revolution, a tax revolution, if the people refuse to pay the property taxes, don't blame Orval Keyes. Blame yourself and blame the boy sitting in the corner office over there because we are sitting at the point right now where the 7% increase on the total budget means that the budget on property taxes will possibly and very likely go up at least 14%. I ask you to bring this bill back, kill it and leave the bill that is there that says property taxes cannot go up more than 7% without a vote of the people. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, I call for the question.
