Committee on Committees report. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Okay, Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Committee on Committees report.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The next item is Senator Warner. There is a motion in regard to LB 234.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner moves to reconsider the action of the vote on Final Reading of LB 234.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members, you will recall the other morning there were not sufficient numbers here. You will recall the Board was held open for some period of time and it seemed to me that under the circumstances that we ought to give the bill a 30 vote reconsideration so that it can be properly considered under normal conditions, whatever they are, and I would urge the body to give the 30 vote reconsideration and then let the bill pass or not pass on its merits rather than some of the other factors that were present.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the reconsideration of LB 234 on Final Reading. Is that right? 30 votes are needed. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. This is the second motion under item #5, Senator Warner is seeking 30 votes for reconsideration of our action on LB 234 on Final Reading. I will call for the question once more. The motion is the Warner motion to reconsider our action on LB 234 on Final Reading.

SENATOR WARNER: Otherwise, Mr. President, I will ask for a Call of the House so you don't have to keep the Board open.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays, to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats. Record your presence. See that unauthorized personnel are off the floor. We have a lot of work to do. The Chair would appreciate you moving back
