Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Simon, Senator Pirsch, Senator Carsten. The motion before the House is the reconsideration of the final vote on LB 234. Is everybody in their seats? The Clerk is authorized to accept call ins.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting no. Senator Newell voting aye. Senator Kelly voting no. Senator Johnson voting aye. Senator Rumery voting aye. Senator Stoney voting no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The question before the House as a result of the reconsideration motion is, shall the bill pass? All in favor, we don't have to read the bill again, all in favor of LB 234 vote aye, opposed vote no. This is on Final Reading. Yes, we are voting on the bill. We do not have to reread it. The Legislature sees fit to reconsider their action so we are voting once more on the bill on Final Reading. Have you all voted? We are not going to be in the position of bargaining for votes. This is Final Reading. All legislators are to be in their seats. The Chair gets a lot of criticism when we don't keep in our seats on Final Reading and try to convince legislators from your seat they ought to vote your way. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See pages 2010 and 2011, Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 16 nays, 3 excused and not voting and 5 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed. Next motion is, if you will notice on your agenda, we have two items on LB 398. These cannot be taken up until the Legislature indicates its desire in regard to the bill which at the moment rests on Select File. So the motion to begin with will be to advance LB 398 to E & R for engrossment. If you recall, the bill failed to advance. The Call is raised. Senator DeCamp, do you wish to make a motion to advance the bill?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I would give her another shot, yes. I move it be advanced.
