SENATOR HOAGLAND: Senator Keyes, I am not sure of the facts. I might indicate with the dollar amount you are talking about this amendment doesn't change the current statute (interruption).

SENATOR KEYES: This amount gets into something like a billion dollars a day that is going on and there is over a hundred million dollars a day goes on in Omaha and other places throughout the state. So what we are trying to do here is penalize that little fellow that bets \$2 on the horses, make sure that he stays in line but we are letting some of the other boys just get loose and go wild at it.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: May I clarify that, Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, because I played that thing for about four years. I know what it is.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: All these amendments that Senator DeCamp and I are talking about deal with our having backup felony provisions for big-time gambling so the prosecutors will have some felony charges they can use to go in and rout out the big-time gamblers if that is necessary.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cope and then Senator Koch. Senator Cope.

SENATOR COPE: Mr. President, I call for the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. The motion is to cease debate. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate is ceased. Now before we recognize Senator DeCamp, we have some technical amendments that have to be adopted.
