SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is...all in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The E & R amendments to LB 152 are adopted.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move that LB 152 be readvanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The E & R..the bill is advanced to E & R for engrossment. Now the first motion is to bring the bill back. Now is Senator DeCamp going to handle the amendment or are you going to handle it? Senator DeCamp. The debate has ceased. The motion that we are working on is the movement of the bill back to Select File for the specific amendment and the Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp. Senator DeCamp, you don't have any other discussion? Okay, the motion is to return the bill to Select File for specific amendment. Senator Chambers, do you wish to speak on this? You don't wish to speak on the motion to bring the bill back. The motion is to bring the bill back to Select File for the specific amendments that have been explained. All in favor of bringing the bill back vote aye, opposed no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return to Select File, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is returned and now the Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp on discussion of the amendments? We are now on a motion to adopt the amendment to the bill. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: The amendment is the DeCamp-Hoagland amendment. I move its adoption. It has been discussed until who laid the chunk already.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now, Senator Chambers, do you wish to be recognized on the motion to adopt the joint amendments?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, and, Senator...I mean, Mr. Speaker, Senators DeCamp and Hoagland, I am looking at these amendments and if you insist on letting the bill go and letting the police and the U. S. Attorney write the bill, I will let you plunge headlong into this folly, but even the Attorney General's office which is not renowned for always using the circumspection required in giving advice agreed that there were problems with the possession of gambling
