However, when you go to making resolutions directing how the manufacturers of railroad cars and railroad engines do, I wonder if we have looked into this. I read an article awhile back that said that some of these engines were of different width wheels. Can you speak to that, Senator Cullan, just a second perhaps?

SENATOR CLARK: Is there anything further?

SENATOR CULLAN: Visiting the area, I would tell Senator Nichol that some of them are of the same gauge and some of them are not but I think the general intent is to ensure that those that can be retained in the State of Nebraska and used here will be. Again I think if you will look at the resolution, there is some language to that effect as well.

SENATOR NICHOL: Thank you, Senator Cullan. With that I certainly would support his resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Briefly two things, Mr. President, to Senator Nichol may I say that it is also my understanding that those engines being exported all have power steering on them but, secondly, I would like to offer the Warner amendment to the resolution. Senator Warner offered the proposition that until such time as there are enough cars and trains in Nebraska to adequately move the grain that eminent domain be granted to coal slurry pipelines.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Lamb. Your light is on, do you want to talk? Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: I certainly support the legislative resolution.
