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it but I would hope at another time when we have had time to really look into this thing. But we tried to get the laetrile situation cleared up in Nebraska for the last three years and I think today would be a good chance to get a vote on it to see how the legislators really feel. We have not had a chance to do that in the last three years. One of the things that I want to clear up before I finish and that is the fact that some people say it is legal and some people say it is not legal and Senator Labedz has some information on this and I would like to release what time I may have left to her to explain the legality of laetrile as it now exists in the State of Nebraska.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The three of us decided that we would not take more than five minutes at the opening remarks so we are going to try and divide that up. I just wanted this information set out especially for Senator Cullan and some Senators that have mentioned the fact that laetrile is illegal. Now in the Rutherford versus the United States in the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals, which has now been taken to the Supreme Court, but these are the closing remarks: "We conclude that the permanent injunction granted by the district court should be continued but be limited only to permit procurement of intravenous injections administered by a licensed medical practitioner to persons who are certified by a licensed medical practitioner to be terminally ill of cancer in some form. We are confident that the FDA with all due dispatch will promulgate regulations within the above limitation as if the drug was found by the commission to be safe and effective for the limited group of persons here considered." And I would like to turn the rest of my time over to Senator Venditte.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Venditte.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I will be very brief. We are beat, Mr. Speaker, on this issue. Senator Kahle said there were seven, there are now almost twenty amendments on the Speaker's or on the Clerk's desk and I would suspect that if we are going to save at least the twenty-five minutes that we have left here this afternoon, Mr. Speaker...Mr. Speaker...Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR VENDITTE: I would think and I haven't addressed this matter to any of my colleagues, but as I see it, if we are going to resolve this issue within the next twenty-five minutes and dispose of the some twenty amendments, almost twenty amendments, that are now pending on the bill,
