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is suffering from cancer and he has been taking laetrile treatments, and I asked him to describe those to me and he said, well, one of the treatments he has purchased cost \$1000 for twenty-one days of treatment and what that treatment consists of are injections of laetrile because oral pills apparently aren't good enough and what are called "retained enemas" and I asked him what a retained enema was. And he said a retained enema is when you are given a laetrile enema and you are required to retain it for ten or fifteen minutes and then you release it. Now those are the kind of treatments he is getting for \$1000 for twenty-one days and I think it is obvious that if somebody is sold those kinds of treatments in the State of Nebraska, over a fairly short period of time their life savings are going to be exhausted. They are going to be exhausted for treatments by a drug that no doctor I have talked to has indicated it is an effective cure of cancer in any respect at all. So I think to protect citizens in this state who want to use laetrile, why we ought to adopt this particular amendment found on page 1779 which will set prices and prohibit these kinds of consumer ripoffs. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are you speaking to both amendments, Senator Hoagland, or just the one?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Just the one, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I need to ask those who have their lights on for just a little information. I will try to take as little time as possible. Senator Kennedy, do you wish to speak to the bill as a whole? Okay. Senator Hefner, do you wish to speak to the bill as a whole? Senator Cullan, do you wish to speak to the bill as a whole?

SENATOR CULLAN: I would like to call the question, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, I am not calling your name. I am trying to get information. I am sorry. Senator Simon, do you wish to speak to the bill as a whole? Senator Kelly, do you wish to speak to the bill as a whole? Wait a minute. I guess we are ready to vote on the first amendment.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I will waive closing, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. The motion before the House is the adoption of the first Hoagland amendment as explained by
