Senator Hoagland. Now Senator Labeledz, Senator Venditte and Senator Kahle, is this the way you want to handle the situation? Okay. You are voting in favor or against the first Hoagland amendment as explained. Have you all voted? The Chair would urge you to vote as rapidly as possible. We have a time bind. Now I am going to do the best I can to try to help those who have the bill up to try at least to get it processed. Have you all voted? Have you all voted?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would ask for a Call of the House, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators, please take your seats, record your presence. I think those who are interested in this bill would appreciate having you stay as close to your seats as possible until the vote has been taken. As long as all legislators are in their seats, the Clerk is authorized to accept call in votes. We are on the first Hoagland amendment. Senator Landis, Senator Koch, Senator George, Senator Schmit, Senator Beutler, Senator Johnson, Senator Kremer, Senator Goodrich, Senator Newell, Senator Vickers. Is everybody recorded? Senator Hoagland, do you want to continue with the roll call?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I hate to ask for a roll call, Mr. Speaker. A few call in votes, why we could have this thing out of the way.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I posed that alternative that those who are interested can give call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Schmit voting aye. Senator Brennan voting aye. Senator George voting no. Senator Newell voting aye. Senator Goodrich voting no. Senator Beutler voting no.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I ask for a roll call, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Clerk call the roll.
