SENATOR KAHLE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I am not going to take much time. I just think we need a little bit of counter proposal to what has just been said. I personally know people that have taken laetrile and are walking around today. I also have helped carry many of my classmates and people in my age group and buried them because they had cancer, several of them my relatives. I don't believe that we have a cure for cancer today. Some of you talked about the cure for cancer. There is none. If you don't believe it, look at our beloved John Wayne who has gone through hell on earth and is still going to die of cancer. I am not saying laetrile would have helped him. I am not sure what kind of a treatment they are going to prescribe to him now, but at any rate, I am kind of surprised at Senator Kennedy who has had a lot of experience with cancer that he feels the way he does and that perhaps something would have helped. I am not sure. Senator Cullan is a young man. He hasn't seen much sorrow yet. He hasn't seen much of the problems that people face when they know they have cancer and they are groping at straws. I suppose some of you are going to say this is an emotional speech and it is because I feel that people that want to use this substance and feel that it is helping them and has helped them should have that right and I don't think we should deny them. So I very much oppose the kill motion. Thank you.
